

FROM THE DIRECTORS

Fellowship. It's the first word in FOCUS' name: Fellowship of Orthodox Christians United to Serve. A united movement of diverse programs and stakeholders, FOCUS North America exists for the purpose

of moving people from lives of dependency to self-sufficiency. Yet, we are much more than a singular goal or simple catchphrase. Our fellowship brings people together from all walks of life and from all corners of our nation. Unified in this one FOCUS, our staff, board of directors, volunteers, donors, partner ministries, clergy, and those we serve have found an effective and meaningful organization through which, they can offer their unique skills and resources.

The strength of this Fellowship has led to more impact than any of us could have achieved singularly. Rather than apply a single-solution answer to the many problems in our society today, the breadth and depth of the FOCUS movement allows us to design and implement targeted programs that meet the real needs of each city where we operate.

When our Fellowship saw that employed, hardworking people were being excluded from the shifting landscape of healthcare in Pittsburgh, we came together to open the first Orthodox Christian health center in America.

When our Fellowship saw the homeless population in St. Louis living without access to hygiene and shower facilities, we invested in *Shower To The People* an innovative program that has captured the attention and hearts of millions of Americans by



providing dignity and hope through the simple act of being made clean.

And when we became aware of the growing crisis of childhood hunger in America, FOCUS launched a sweeping food service program in 8 cities nationwide that directly enables parishes across the country to help children in their own communities.





FOCUS is effective because of your participation—and for that we are most grateful. Our Fellowship, rooted in the genuine, transformative power of Christ's love knows that

Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10)

Together, in our diverse roles, programs, and geographies, we are *One FOCUS*. We share one ministry, joined by one God, laboring toward the ultimate goal of salvation. 

SUMMER FEEDING PROGRAM

On a dark and cold winter night in Cleveland, two police officers stopped Beverly, a single mother of two who was asking for money on E. 152nd Street. Beverly explained to the officers that her daughters, aged 9 and 11, had not eaten all day. With her paycheck already spent on rent and utilities, she was asking for a few extra dollars to feed her girls. Instead of giving Beverly a ticket for panhandling, the officers took her to FOCUS' St. Herman House, where they knew Beverly would be given bags of groceries to tide her over.

Across America, millions of families face the same struggle as Beverly. An astounding 17 million children are "food insecure" meaning they do not have consistent access to the nutrition they need to grow and succeed in life. Many of these children rely on free and reduced price meals at their local schools. But when school lets out for the summer, they suddenly find themselves hungry with nowhere to go.

In response, FOCUS launched its *Summer Feeding Program* in Phoenix, Arizona—one of America's cities hardest hit by childhood hunger—and served 17,185 meals. In 2016, FOCUS plans to expand the program to eight cities and serve 46,000 meals to disadvantaged children. The program will have direct impact on children who are hungry through no fault of their own while engaging volunteers from parishes to provide children with activities that encourage learning and lifelong health. Jake Austin has long been involved with providing assistance to the homeless in St. Louis. On one of his regular walks through town to give the homeless toiletry kits, he was stopped by a man who pointed out that there was nowhere to use the soap Jake was handing out. With a job interview in just two days, the homeless man didn't have any place to shower.

In 2015, FOCUS North America incorporated Jake's Shower To The People, a mobile shower truck that connects to fire hydrants to provide showers, sinks and hygiene supplies to the homeless.

Most of us take it for granted, but for the many people who don't have a home or paid utilities, a simple shower has the ability to not only

restore hygiene, but also dignity and hope. "Taking a shower can often be the first step in giving someone the confidence to reconnect with family, apply for a job, or take the next step in getting off the streets," says Austin. "It's hard to get a job if you look and smell like you're homeless."

The Shower To The People program is about more than just getting clean. Through a partnership with a national soap and beauty product company, anyone who showers in the truck will be invited to participate in job training and placement activities. In addition, Shower To The People is part of a collaborative effort to refer the homeless to numerous other services provided by local agencies. ONENESS IN FAITH

A formerly homeless man once asked us, "You've given me a job, a home, and brought my family back together. When do we get to pray together?"

FOCUS stands apart from many other social service agencies because we understand the role of faith in restoring a life. FOCUS' programs never require any faith participation or commitment from those we serve, but we see that people are naturally drawn to—and need—an element of faith to fulfill their transformation to self-sufficiency.

Communal and individual prayer is the bedrock on which our ministry is built. Participants on Youth Equipped to Serve (YES) trips pray for those they encounter during their experience. Many FOCUS Centers are located in Orthodox church facilities or have dedicated chapels. A new mission parish of the Antiochian Orthodox Archdiocese, St. Moses the Black, grew out of the FOCUS Pittsburgh Center in 2013.

We know that prayer is also a strong component in your homes and parishes. Your prayers for our work and for those we serve are essential in keeping this ministry centered on our mission of compassion and service to each other and to those in need.



HEALTHCARE

While the number of uninsured Americans has decreased over the past few years, the figures are still far too high: more than 33 million Americans were without health insurance in 2014.

Who are America's uninsured? More than 80% are in low-income working families—those who earn too much to qualify for government programs, but do not earn enough to afford coverage of their own.

Providing healthcare is an important component of FOCUS' mission because it is very difficult to sustainably transition a person or a family from homelessness, poverty and dependency to a life of self-sufficiency without providing for their health. The FOCUS Pittsburgh Free Health Center specifically targets and serves uninsured working adults. In 2015, the clinic had 428 patient visits, ranging from preventative care to surgery.

We're excited about the future of healthcare within FOCUS. Our goal is to replicate our Pittsburgh model to other cities, beginning with Minneapolis where we will soon open a mobile health clinic.











FOCUS' Youth Equipped to Serve (YES) program provides opportunities for youth, young adults, and families to participate in formative weekends of service, with the ultimate purpose of raising the next generation of Orthodox Christians to lead others serving their neighbors through their daily actions. campus will share the message of love and solidarity with others, break down stereotypes, and provide a way for your community to serve Christ through serving others.
