For FOCUS North America, 2021 was a journey overflowing with love and accomplishments. It was also a year of challenges, including the ongoing realities associated with COVID, that could only be overcome by God's Grace. We developed a ministry to serve formerly incarcerated individuals at FOCUS Gateway City in St. Louis, and we expanded our reach with new community partners in Southern California. FOCUS Detroit refitted a shipping container to be a free store for people needing clothes and personal items, which is anticipated to open before the end of 2022.


We are grateful for your support, and for the many foundations, individuals, and other funders whose gifts made the past years' ministry possible. With your generosity, we connected with people who faced the hardships of poverty across the country, and offered them vital life sustaining assistance. Your financial support was essential in providing diapers in Alexandria, Virginia to families who are in "diaper need," and in New Castle, Pennsylvania you helped men residing in a local homeless shelter learn culinary arts as a means to gain sustainable employment.

We are thankful for the volunteers who spent countless hours giving of themselves across the country. In Minnesota, for example, over 7,000 community meals were served by volunteers, and in Cleveland, Ohio where St. Herman House FOCUS Cleveland saw 423 essential items distributed by volunteers. It is from the love and connection that arise from these selfless acts of service that people in need are connected to the transformative love of Christ.

When you review this 2021 Annual Report, travel with us on our journey across the country to see how your support has been essential over the last year. The Church remains our road map on this journey and our faith in Jesus Christ is our compass.

As Orthodox Christians, we are filled with hope, and in that hope we seek those opportunities that the Lord provides to better serve Him. "For in His hope we are saved..." (Rom 8.24-25)

Starting in Orange County, FOCUS' regional footprint expanded in 2021. With programs in Orange County, Los Angeles, and San Diego, 962 volunteers have taken on the challenge of finding solutions to the needs of people experiencing poverty all over Southern California.

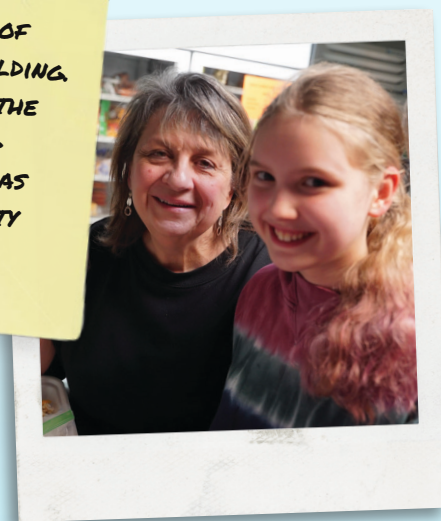

FOCUS Minnesota provides food, clothing, hygiene items, and community to marginalized and underserved people in the Minneapolis/St. Paul area. In 2021, volunteers helped provide 22,412 essential items such as coats, clothing, shoes, and hygiene products to guests.

FOCUS Gateway City strives to create a community where any person in need can find rest for their souls and resources to help meet their needs. In 2021 FOCUS Gateway City welcomed a new center director. Understanding the root of all poverty is disconnection - staff, volunteers, and guests make it a point to get to know each other during community meals, food pantry, and clothing closet hours.

FOCUS Detroit creates opportunities to fulfill Christ's call to "Love God and neighbor." With the help of donors and volunteers, FOCUS Detroit served 3,630 hot meals to people in need in 2021. Clothing and hygiene items, including diapers, were made available for men, women, and families who needed them. Together alongside churches, partner agencies, and individual volunteers - FOCUS Detroit is combatting symptoms of poverty by creating community and kinship between neighbors.

FOCUS Cleveland provides shelter and support for homeless men on the path to well-being and independence, while also meeting the basic needs of people in the community. In 2021 FOCUS Cleveland provided 44 men with emergency shelter, and 21 men with transitional housing. Over 50% of residents that moved out in 2021 moved into stable housing after staying at St. Herman House. In addition to shelter, FOCUS Cleveland also provides basic needs to the greater community, including: clothing, hygiene items, meals, grocery items, and access to clean toilets & showers.

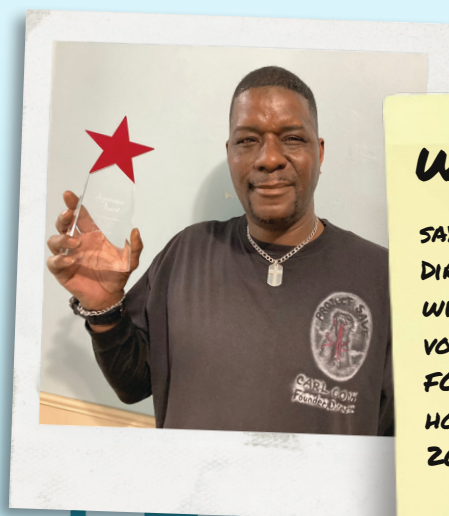

BACK TO SCHOOL SUPPORT

Back to School Backpacks Children living in poverty are often forced to skip school, unable to participate in sports and playground activities, and face health risks because of inadequate shoes, food, or school supplies. FOCUS reaches these children through its annual Back To School Backpack program, designed to mobilize Orthodox Communities by engaging parishes in providing high quality backpacks and supplies for local children experiencing the effects of poverty.

HYGIENE OUTREACH

St. Nicholas Sacks Over 40 million Americans live below the poverty line, and struggle to meet their basic needs every day. When unexpected emergencies arise, these neighbors can be thrown into crises such as hunger and food insecurity, massive medical debt, and even homelessness. FOCUS partners with Orthodox Communities to offer relief to people experiencing poverty and homelessness by providing basic hygiene supply kits to these neighbors in need.

FAMILY CARE DRIVES

DC Family Care Drive Sufficient supply of diapers for one child can cost a family between \$75 and \$100 a month. West Central PA - Working together as community partners in 2021, FOCUS and the New Castle City Rescue Mission offered a Food Manager Certification class for men at the Rescue Mission. The program included ServSafe certification, as well as culinary training. Through this collaboration, FOCUS donors and volunteers were able to help the men at the Rescue Mission learn employable skills and find jobs in the food industry.

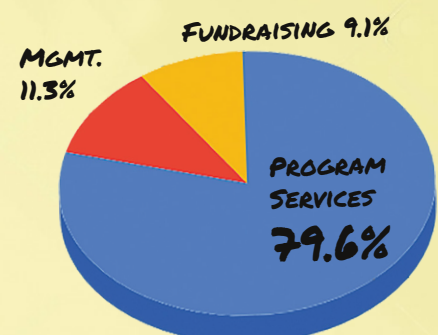
